About the speaker



Dan J. Rice III, CPA, Managing Director and Portfolio Manager, is a member of BlackRock's Global Resources team responsible for managing small cap and all cap energy portfolios.

Mr. Rice's service with the firm dates back to 1984, including his years with State Street Research & Management (SSRM), which merged with BlackRock in 2005. At SSRM, he was a Senior Vice President and portfolio manager responsible for small cap and all cap energy products. Mr. Rice earned a BS degree from Bates College in 1973 and a MBA degree from New York University in 1975.

WHAT IS THE PAPG?

PAPG is a non-profit organization founded in 1984 to provide a forum for Petroleum Geologists in the Pittsburgh Area to meet socially and discuss technical topics relative to the exploration and development of reserves in the Northern and Central Appalachian Basin. PAPG is an affiliated association with AAPG (American Association of Petroleum Geologists) and has representation in the House of Delegates. Although PAPG is predominately a geologic organization, numerous industry professionals including geophysicists, engineers, lawyers and landmen are among PAPG's members and find the interaction at meetings and educational opportunities beneficial to their professions. Meetings are typically held monthly from September through May in locations within 50 miles of downtown Pittsburgh. From time to time, meetings are held in conjunction with SPE and PGS.

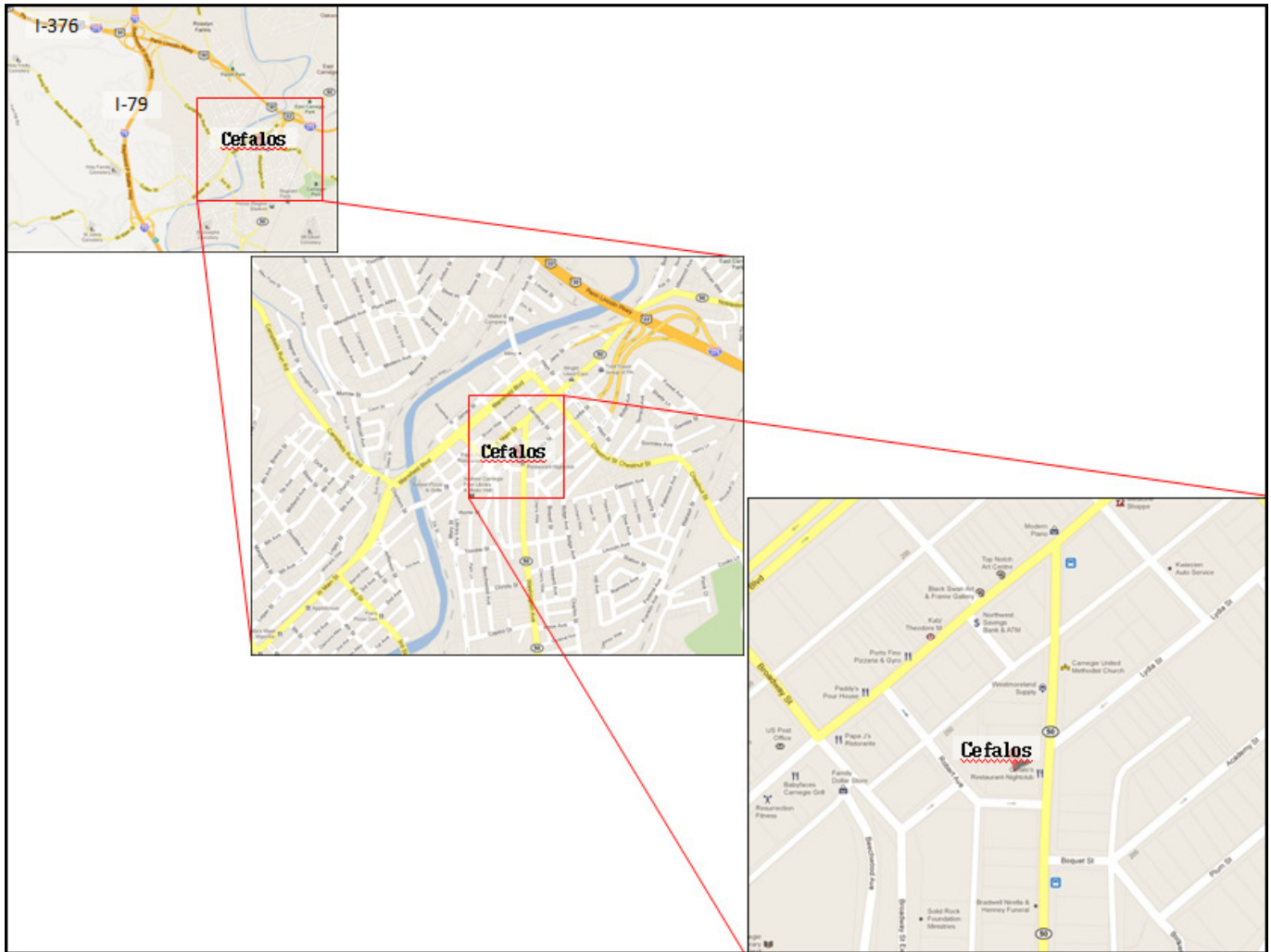

From the West:

Take I-376E to exit 65 toward PA-50 W/Carnegie
Merge onto Lydia St
Turn left onto Washington Avenue
Cefalo's will be on the right

From the South:

Take I-70W/I-79N to exit 57 toward Carnegie
Merge onto W Main St
Turn right onto Jefferson St
Take the first left onto W Main St
Turn right onto Washington Avenue
Cefalo's will be on the right

From the North:

Take I-79 S to exit 59A to merge onto I-376 E/US 22 E/US 30E toward Pittsburgh
